## HPCA April Meeting Recap

The meeting of April 2, 2019 was called to order by **Vice President Chris Delphin**. There were 17 attendees.

Chris introduced our guest speakers **Khang Nguyen** and **Megan Campbell** from the Traffic Management Branch of the Public Works Department. This branch is responsible for performing engineering studies, plan reviews and field investigation related to traffic safety, traffic courts, street lighting, school zones, speed humps, railroad safety and quiet zones, view obstructions, neighborhood cut- through traffic and Capital Improvement Plan projects.

Public Works has five service lines - capital improvement, customer account line, permits, Houston water treatment plant, and transportation and drainage operation. The traffic management is in charge of school zones, street lights, lane closures and signals. A new branch has been formed called Structure Planning –Ms Campbell is in charge of this. She works mainly with super neighborhoods. The best way to get in touch is through 311 and you will get rerouted.

The audience had many questions. excessive speeding at Commonwealth and Waugh was cited. This is very close to Wilson Elementary and yet there is no school zone sign. At Commonwealth and Nevada a dog walker was hit by a car. This is a very dark section of the road. Mr. Nguyen said he would look into both of these areas. Potholes were brought up. The Overlay Program where they cover the hole with asphalt was discussed. One resident wanted to do a neighborhood assessment and see if neighbors would chip in to fix the streets. Ms Campbell was not sure if this would be allowed to happen. Bike lanes were also brought up. New bike lanes are 5 feet wide but older ones are 2 to 3 feet wide and more dangerous for the bike rider. Possibly through the Capital Improvement Plan funds, some quick restriping could be done to allow bikers more room. Peden and Bomar Streets are being used as cut-through streets. Residents wanted to know about getting speed humps installed or to get stop signs installed. A traffic study would have to be done and there is probably not enough traffic to warrant either of these. A resident asked about getting a study of our whole neighborhood done instead of calling 311 for each problem. A request can be submitted by the President.

Several interesting websites were mentioned- BuildHoustonforward.org-formally known as ReBuild Houston, publicworkshouston.tx.gov/home, Town Halls, Neighborhood Traffic Management Program and the Mayor's Safer Streets Initiative. You can find lots of information here. The Safer Street Bill was also brought up. According to this bill, the default speed limit would be lowered from 30 mph to 25 mph. This would apply where other speed limits are not posted - primarily local residential neighborhood streets. Lots of interesting topics were discussed and Chris thanked Mr. Nguyen and Ms Campbell for joining us and helping us with these problems.

The Business Meeting was then called to order. We will be meeting in Lamar Park at 9:00am Saturday April 6 for our part of Keep Houston Beautiful. Tom Whitworth said coffee and donuts would be provided. We may meet after at Rudyard's for some refreshments. And then there was a little update to this-KHB was postponed until May 4. This will give people more time to sign up and join us. So please sign up now!

Treasurer's Report – The balance for March was \$14,446.00. Current expenses include \$1,231.16 for the printing of 2 newsletters, \$140.72 for Lamar Park, and \$50.44 for newsletter software and miscellaneous. Our current balance is \$13,379.84.

Deed Restriction- everything is going nicely. Mandel Montrose looks to be officially closed - signs are down.

Membership- the next Happy Hour will be April 17, 2019 at LaGrange from 6-8.

The meeting was closed at 7:35.

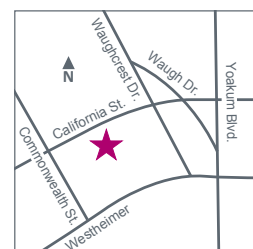

## Did You Know?

Did you know? ... Graffiti! Is it menace or art? Just kidding. This DYK article is not about whether we should celebrate or spurn graffiti in the neighborhood. Rather, it's about the penalties Houston imposes for those caught doing graffiti. The penalty for graffiti can be a misdemeanor if damage is less than \$500. The offense can also be a felony if damages are more than \$500. The degree of the felony depends on the amount of damage done. A misdemeanor includes a fine, time in jail or both. A City ordinance prohibits any citizen under the age of 17 from purchasing "implements of graffiti," including spray paint and big-tipped markers. Houston treats graffiti as a crime, not a prank.

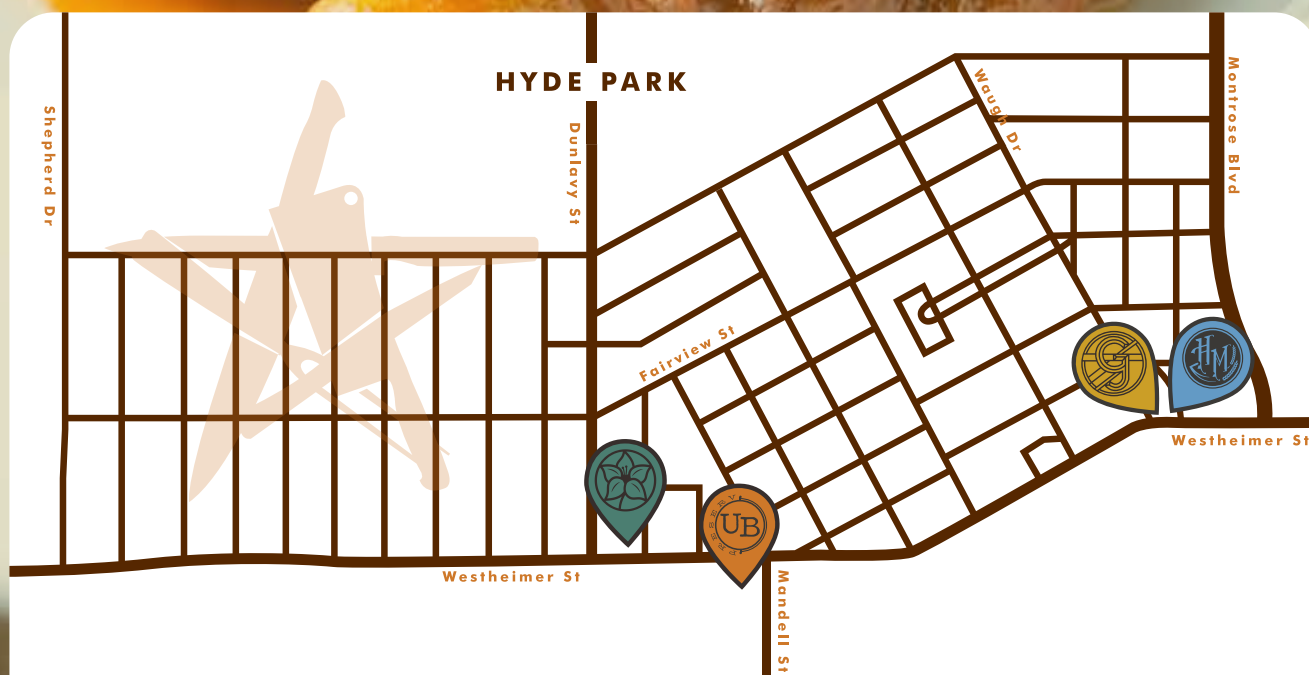
